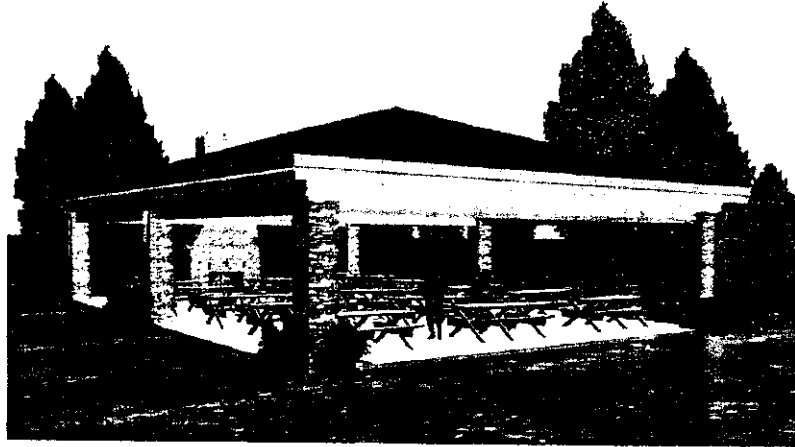

## Construction planned to begin August 1, 2006 on the Matt Maupin Welcome Pavilion At East Fork State Park

### All Volunteer planning construction team to build Pavilion at Public Beach

Starting August 1, 2006, the construction team being assembled will construct a 40' x 70' Pavilion at the East Fork State Park Public Beach, next to the Clermont County Chamber of Commerce Monument in the center of the beach lawn. Plans for the Pavilion were created by Len J. Bonomini, R.A. of KBA, Inc., Architects, C. Doug Walker, P.E., P.S. of SWA Design Group, Inc. and Mark D. Walker, P.E., P.S. of Professional Engineering Group, LLC.

Mike Barnard of ML Barnard, Inc., Design-Build Services, a leading Clermont County commercial builder and Jim Sauls of Sauls Construction Co., of Batavia, head the

construction team. All of the planning and construction team are volunteers, committed to constructing a Pavilion, as Jim Sauls put it, that:

The pile of stones is growing at the entrance to the public beach.
